Banbury and the Canal		Lower KS2
Curriculum link	The National Curriculum for geography requires KS2 pupils to learn about key features and understand how people have used natural resources over time	
Why Purpose of the workshop	- To discover that Banbury has both river and a canal, running through the town - The Museum has an internal bridge with views right over the canal, allowing fieldwork for all children, in all weathers	
What Main concepts and knowledge the workshop covers	- To discover the difference between a canal and a river, and recognise how to tell them apart - To observe the canal as it goes through town, and play a game to record the physical features and human features of different dates - With costumes, props, photos and artworks, to explore how the use of the canal, its boats and the surrounding land have changed over time	
How Summary of the structure and teaching style	- Sessions are structured with a scene-setting starter, then observational and hands-on activities, and end with reflection and recap - For some activities, the class is divided into groups - Our teaching style is fun, accessible and adaptable - We ask that teachers help with some activities, such as dress-up - The session is authentic and exciting and includes some heavy or fragile objects. All have been risk assessed and are suitable for most KS2 children - We have costumes in both larger and smaller sizes - We understand that not every child will be comfortable with all activities
