Curriculum link	The National Curriculum for history requires KS1 pupils to learn how everyday items have changed in living memory	
Why Purpose of the workshop	- To discover that people in the past had fewer materials and simpler technology than we use today - To understand chronology and change using fun, familiar objects	
What Main concepts and knowledge the workshop covers	- To experiment with toys and household equipment from about 1910 to 1960, using mostly good quality replicas - To use observational skills and deductive reasoning to distinguish between old and new toys, and explain the differences and similarities - To dress up and learn how to play with unfamiliar objects, imagining the pros and cons of living in the past and living now - In the Museum, to see old toys, cycles, clothes, and a full-size cart	
How Summary of the structure and teaching style	- Sessions are structured with a scene-setting starter, then immersive play activities, and end with reflection and recap - For some activities, the class is divided into groups - Our teaching style is fun, accessible and adaptable - We ask that teachers help with some activities, such as dress-up - The session is authentic and exciting and includes some heavy or fragile objects. All have been risk assessed and are suitable for most EY and KS1 children - We have costumes in both larger and smaller sizes - We understand that not every child will be comfortable with every activity
