Victorians - Key Stage 2

Key themes

Why was the Victorian period such a significant turning point in British history?

Focusing on the local area, this workshop looks at the inventions, discoveries and social progress of the 19th century.

Using real and replica objects, hands-on activities and dress-up material, pupils will:

- Discover how children's lives changed in Victorian times
- Find out how everyday life, work and transport were transformed
- Learn about the coming of factories to Banbury
- Gain an understanding of rich and poor in the 19th century

Learning Outcomes

- Understanding the importance of Victorian Britain in shaping modern life
- Understanding social and technological changes over time
- Developing skills in questioning, imagining, thinking critically and evaluating
- Improving knowledge of chronology
- Learning new vocabulary and skills

Adaptations

- Outreach: Ideally this workshop is taught at the Museum, where we have a large number of objects. However, an adapted version can be taught as an outreach workshop at your school – 75 mins teaching time for up to 30 children, cost £90 or £150 for two classes one after the other on the same day
